Educational Objectives

The objective of CPC Coastal Cruising is to teach students the skills necessary to expand their boating horizons confidently and safely. Whether it's for a short weekend trip or an extended cruise, students learn how to properly prepare for a voyage into unfamiliar waters on a twin inboard power vessel. With the skills learned in CPC 1000 as a building block, this curriculum teaches critical cruising elements that include piloting and chart navigation, electronic charting and radar, running inlets and handling common emergencies underway.

Students put their newly learned skills to the test with specially structured underway exercises on board a Chapman training vessel. This program includes approximately 16 hours of "hands-on" training simulating the types of real world situations encountered while underway.

Designed for serious boaters who want to increase their cruising skills in a fun, practical and hands on learning environment. Each class is taught by U.S.C.G. licensed, professional instructors using Chapman School's unique "Learn at the Helm" approach. Class size, on board, is limited to 5 students to maximize individual attention and instruction while underway.

CPC 2000 provides the foundation for advanced curricula of CPC 3000 and 4000 certification levels.

Course Description

Inland and Coastal Chart Navigation - 9 hours

Inland piloting techniques, Aids to Navigation, Rules of the Road, off-shore position determination, and tides and currents planning.

Voyage Planning - 8 hours

Chart selection, route planning and development, route analysis, watch standing & responsibilities, fuel requirements, provisioning, using electronic navigation tools, radar and weather reporting sources.

Voyage Execution & Cruising Skills - 16 hours (underway)

Pre-departure procedures, transiting inlets, using charts and electronic navigation equipment en-route, monitoring essential vessel systems, docking and undocking procedures, MOB recovery, transiting bridges, and marina considerations.

Admission Requirements

- **Prerequisite** - The successful completion of CPC 1000.
- Minimum student age is 18.
- Submission of completed and signed Registration Form and non-refundable deposit.
- Provide official photo ID on the first day of class.
- Class requires a minimum of two (2) students.

Testing & Certification

Students who have successfully completed the program and pass both the written CPC 2000 exam and the boat handling skills test given at the conclusion of the program will be awarded a "Certificate of Completion" from the Chapman School of Seamanship.

Tuition

- Non-refundable deposit of \$200.00 due with completed Registration Form.
- Tuition balance due 10 days prior to the start of class.
- Tuition includes all books, supplies and laboratory fees.
- Tuition does not include housing or transportation.
- All costs are payable in U.S. currency only.
- School accepts all major credit cards.

Transfer/Refund Policy

- If Registration not accepted by the School, all payments will be fully refunded.
- Where notice is provided to School more than 3 business days before the start of class to transfer registration to a different class, a \$50.00 change fee will apply.
- Where notice is provided to School more than 3 business days before start of class to cancel registration, applicant will be obligated for the non-refundable tuition deposit.
- Where notice is provided to School less than 3 business days before start of class to transfer or cancel registration; or if the applicant does not arrive for the scheduled class; or if the applicant withdraws from class once classes have begun, applicant may be obligated for the full amount of the tuition.
- Applicable refunds are made within thirty (30) days.

Student Housing

- Apartments have a bedroom, convertible living room/bedroom, kitchen, bathroom, and covered porch. Apartments are air-conditioned, furnished, and equipped with counter top range, refrigerator, and cooking utensils.
- Number of students per apartment is generally a maximum of two.
- Housing is offered on a space available basis.
- School is not responsible for loss of any personal property. Sorry, no pets.

Housing Fees

Housing Fee.... \$60.00(per night)

- For a second or third person in a party add \$20 per night/per person
- Housing includes utilities.
- Housing fees are due 10 days prior to the start of class.

Housing Refund

- If a student cancels prior to the start of class, housing fees will be refunded.
- Once a student moves into the facilities no fees will be refunded.
- In the event of damage to the accommodations, the student will be responsible for all costs required to repair the damaged school property.
- Applicable refunds are made within thirty (30) days.

Travel Considerations

If travelling to the School from outside of Florida we strongly suggest you purchase refundable air fares or arrange for trip cancellation insurance.

Notes:

Each student is required to furnish his or her own deck shoes.
